Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

First, I would like to express my gratitude to all of you who came to my farewell reception. In particular, I want to thank the parish staff who worked very hard to make this a special event for me. Today is my last official day here at St. Mary's by the Sea. Tomorrow, I will be leaving for Vietnam to visit my relatives and friends for two weeks, and I will be going to my new assignment after that. Again, I am very grateful to all of you for your love, support and prayers during the last two years here at St. Mary's by the Sea. Please keep me in your prayers and all of you are in mine. If you are happen to pass by Our Lady of la Vang in Santa Ana, please stop by to say hello. May God bless all of you through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary our patroness. Adios, Good-bye, and farewell.

The theme of today's Feast of **Pentecost is that God gives us talents and gifts.**

Acts 2:1-11 – The narrative of Pentecost is done in a way reminiscent of the giving of the law on Mount Sinai. The new twelve, like twelve tribes of Israel, are gathered for the event. There is a noise from the sky filling the whole house, just like there was a strong noise of God on Mount Sinai that shook up the whole mountain. The fire of Pentecost resembles the fire of Sinai – evoking the manifestation or theophany of God. The tongues of fire are symbolic of the presence of God which will be manifested in human language, the prophetic mission of the disciples.

1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 – One of the effects of Gnosticism in Paul's community is that those who did not have the gifts of the Spirit were treated as inferior. Glossolalia (speaking in tongues) was an example of this. This caused division in the community. All the gifts of the Spirit are for the good of the Body; however, St. Paul lists a series of gifts or charisms. It was not an exhaustive list, but an illustration of the variety and plurality characteristics of the community where there were all kinds of people with all kinds of gifts.

John 20:19-23 – In New Testament the forgiveness of sin is associated to Baptism. It is not strange, then, that the commandment to forgive sins has a missionary emphasis. Baptism was not conferred on those who did not believe after hearing the Good news. Pentecost was a day of baptism in the early church. It is therefore fitting to give this mandate of this day. We need to ask ourselves this question: **What talents or virtues do I have that I could place at the service of the community or of the good of others?** May the Holy Spirit continue to work in each one of us as we bring about the message of Jesus' love to all people around us.
