Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Ascension. It is good for us to recall what difference it makes to the overall gospel message and what we believe about Jesus as being fully God and fully man. At every Sunday Mass and at the other celebrations, we proclaim the Ascension in our Creed. **He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.** And then we proceed to make a most spectacular assertion, that having ascended to glory, Jesus will return to judge all humanity. So, to believe in the Ascension means more than just a tidy conclusion to his earthly life and ministry. It is an event that has ramifications for all who profess him to be our Lord and Savior.

The Ascension of Jesus into heaven, where he now reigns as King of the universe, speaks of several important things. It is the culmination of the great mystery of the Incarnation that began with the Annunciation, where the Word became flesh and took to himself our human existence. And, while it is an end of one aspect of salvation history, it is the beginning of another.

At the Ascension, Jesus promised to be with his disciples through the ages. He would not abandon them or us. Through the mystery of the Ascension, He who once lived on earth is now present to every generation and age, by the power of the Holy Spirit and through the graces of the Sacraments. The Ascension also speaks to our hopes, that where Jesus has gone, we one day will follow. We can be confident that Jesus, who intercedes for us at the right hand of the Father, will see to it that we have everything we need to grow in holiness, and that one day we will join him in paradise.

As we celebrate this great feast of our faith, let us hear with refreshed hearts the promise of Christ to be with us always. Let us also recall his promise to send the Holy Spirit, that we might be enlightened in faith, so we can be faithful in all ways to our new identity in Christ. Let us pray that as we go forth from this Sunday's celebration we might be filled with the hope of eternal life in God, a hope founded in the person of Christ, who is both fully human and fully divine.
