**Pastor's Corner**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, Catholic parishes in the United States will begin praying the texts of the mass using a new English translation of the Roman Missal.

**Liturgy of the Eucharist**

Nourished by God's word, and the priest's homily, we responded by professing our faith in the Creed and by presenting to God our petitions. We now prepare to receive Jesus' body and blood in the Liturgy of the Eucharist. We begin by preparing the altar for the holy sacrifice to come. In the Prayer Over the Gifts we get ready to offer ourselves and our lives together with the bread and wine that we, too, might be transformed by God. In the Preface Dialog we declare that it is right and just to give thanks to the Lord our God, and in the Preface we proclaim the reasons that we have to give our thanks and praise. Then comes the great Eucharistic Prayer by which we render our thanks and praise to God the Father. As we recall what Jesus said and we do what he did at the Last Supper, God transforms the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, and we pray that we will also be transformed by the Eucharist we celebrate and receive. We ratify this wonderful action with the Great Amen, and prepare for the culmination of the Liturgy of the Eucharist in Holy Communion.

**Guidelines for Altar Servers**

**The Ministry of Altar Server**

GIRM 100. Lay ministers may be deputed to serve at the altar and assist the priest and the deacon; they may carry the cross, the candles, the thurible, the bread, the wine, and the water.

GIRM 187. The duties that the acolyte may carry out are of various kinds and several may coincide. Hence, it is desirable that these duties be suitably distributed among several acolytes. If, however, only one acolyte is present, he should perform the more important duties while the rest are to be distributed among several ministers.

Since the role of Altar Server is integral to the normal celebration of the Mass, at least one Altar Server should assist the priest. On Sundays and other more important occasions, two or more servers should be employed to carry out the various functions normally entrusted to these ministers.

**Requirements**

Altar Servers should be mature enough to understand their responsibilities and to carry them out well and with appropriate reverence. They should have already received Holy Communion for the first time and normally receive the Eucharist whenever they participate in the liturgy.

**Formation**

Altar Servers should receive proper formation before they begin their ministry. The formation should include instruction on the Mass and its parts and their meaning, the various objects used in the liturgy (their names and use), and the various functions of the Altar Server during the Mass and other liturgical celebrations.

**Dress Code**

Altar Servers may wear an alb or other suitable vesture or other appropriate or dignified clothing.

**Function at Liturgical Celebrations**

No distinction should be made between the functions carried out in the sanctuary by men and boys and those carried out by women and girls. The correct term is "altar servers" and should be used for those who carry out the functions of the instituted acolyte.

Altar Servers carry the cross, the processional candles, hold the book for the priest celebrant when he is not at the altar, carry the incense and censer, present the bread, wine, and water to the priest during the preparation of the gifts or assist him when he receives the gifts from the people, wash the hands of the priest, assist the priest celebrant and deacon as necessary.

Altar Servers are to participate in the Mass. They are to respond to the prayers and the dialogues of the priest along with the congregation. They also join in singing the hymns and other chants of the liturgy.

Altar Servers should be seated in a place from which they can easily assist the priest celebrant and deacon. The place next to the priest is normally reserved for the deacon.

Altar Servers may not distribute Holy Communion unless they have been mandated for this function by the bishop.

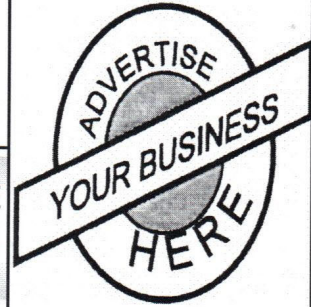

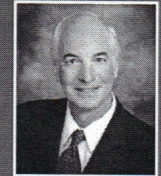
