Pastor's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, Catholic parishes in the United States will begin praying the texts of the mass using a new English translation of the Roman Missal.

Embracing Change in the Liturgy

What exactly is changing?

The structure of the Mass (the order of the elements, the Introductory Rites, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist, Concluding Rites, the posture and the actions of the priest, and the people) remains unchanged in the new edition of the Roman Missal. However, the translation of the prayer texts will change to more closely reflect the original Latin texts. In some cases, new options for prayers may be available, and some old options may no longer be present.

How can I prepare for the change?

There are many ways we can prepare for the changes in the Mass.

- Make a conscious effort to participate more fully in the Mass each Sunday and holy day.
- Take advantage of the special catechetical workshop sessions we are offering.
- Visit the Roman Missal Web site (www.usccb.org/romanmissal) to study the new texts and to learn more about the changes.
- Read the new texts of the people's parts at Mass. Begin to study them so that you will be able to pray them well when the new Roman Missal is implemented on the first Sunday of Advent.
- Pray for a renewal of love for the Liturgy in your parish and in the Church.

Ministry of Hospitality

(continued from last week)

Ushers and Greeters are called to be Ministers of Hospitality. They are entrusted with promoting a sense of welcoming and belonging to all the faithful assembled for worship. They are the first point of contact for the communal celebration of the Liturgy and because of this, should take special steps in being living representatives of the Parish Mission Statement.

Ministers of Hospitality minister to the entire community in a very active way. By freeing each person of their own personal impediments to the Mass through a welcoming atmosphere, Ministers of Hospitality take an active role in enabling each person to come to a more freer expression of God in the Liturgy.

Requirements

1. The Ministry of Hospitality is truly a service to the Church and should be treated seriously and with great dignity. Therefore, Ministers of Hospitality should have an understanding of the Liturgy in order to be effective in providing the faithful with the proper environment.
2. In addition, the following attributes will assist the ministers of seeking Jesus' face in the face of each and every person who comes into the church: patience, reverence, sensitivity compassion, understanding, gentleness, embracing a sense of the family gathered as the Body of Christ.
3. Your participation in the Ministry of Hospitality should be a direct reflection of your own prayer life which is nurtured by the Word of God and reception of Holy Eucharist thereby imbuing with you a spirit of dignity and respect.

ALERT!! Stop AB-499

There is an extremely urgent threat where the state is attempting to assume your role as your child's parent in AB-499. This bill allows a minor child **12 years old and older** to consent to any vaccine for a sexually transmitted disease (such as the HPV Vaccine – **Gardasil**) without parental knowledge or consent. AB-499 violates the right of parents to make consequential healthcare decisions for their children and can jeopardize their lives and health. According to the Center for Disease Control, 53 deaths have been reported from the use of *Gardasil* (just one of the drugs covered by this bill).

The critical time is NOW! AB-499 has already passed the house and Senate and is now scheduled to go before Governor Jerry Brown. **CALL Gov. Brown at (916) 445-2841 ASAP** and tell him you are **OPPOSED** to AB-499!
