Reflections of the Week

God's Reward is the Kingdom.

Congratulations! Welcome to the Kingdom! Rejoice and leap for joy! Sounds a little like Easter, doesn't it? Well, in a very real way, it is. This Sunday, the scriptures remind us that we are blessed and beloved, especially when we have difficulties and don't feel especially blessed. Jesus reminds us that God blesses us in our trials, so we should trust in the saving power of God. We are raised from the dead, as it were, each time we arise from our hardships. The ultimate proof of all of this is our new life in Christ, who died so that we could be free of sin, and was raised from the dead so that we might all have new life. Wouldn't that be something? A new life, in which poverty is riches and sadness is transformed into lightness of spirit? It's a topsy-turvy world, isn't it? Do you feel blessed today?

Today's Gospel from Luke is the Sermon on the Plain with the Beatitudes, what we usually think of as the Sermon on the Mount. It seems as though Jesus is congratulating those who would have been considered unfortunate, doesn't it? The Beatitude statements overturn the concept of fortunate in Jesus' time, naming those who are poor, hungry, mourning, or marginalized as those who should rejoice. Jesus continues with prophetic and startling "Woe to you!" statements, directed to those usually thought of as blessed. Heavenly reward is not a privilege of the rich and comfortable, but a blessing for all who trust in God, whose reward will be great in heaven.

The first reading and the psalm take a somewhat different focus: trust in God, not people or things of this world. One who trusts in God is fortunate, like a plant that produces good fruit, sustained by living waters and currents of grace. Not so the wicked, who wither and vanish, blowing away like the illusions of their self-absorption.

Paul, in the second reading, confronts members of the early Christian community of Corinth who were doubting, or devaluing, belief in Jesus' resurrection and the general resurrection of the dead. Depending on the material world in their spiritual pride, they believed that their righteousness was something they had achieved on their own. They felt self-sufficient, rich, and not in need of the ongoing saving power of Christ's resurrection that completes the sacrifice of Good Friday through Easter, which is our true blessing. *So, congratulations!* Acknowledging our need for God, we are rich in the Kingdom love of our Father. Our hunger is satisfied by the sustaining nourishment of the Spirit. Our weeping is turned into dancing knowing that Jesus is with us in our sorrows, in fact knew them when he walked upon earth. Reasons enough for us to rejoice, always, even when people treat us badly. God's reward to us is the Kingdom, now and always.

Update of our Relit Program

We just would like to thank those of you who have been attending our Relit Program. The response to it has been overwhelmingly positive. Over 40 parishioners are participating in the program. Unfortunately, we cannot add any more people to this session, but will have a new session begin after Easter.

2019 Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA)
"We Are One"

One of the most exceptional parts of belonging to St. Mary's by the Sea is knowing that we are part of something much greater than any one person. Our Church connects us all - as neighbors, as a community, as children of God and followers of Christ. From faith formation to outreach in the community, to social and community activities, our parish is alive in the spirit.

This week, all registered parishioners will be receiving information by mail on the **2019 Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA)**. The PSA helps to support the ministries of our Diocesan Church in all of our parishes and centers, and helps to strengthen the bonds of communion and family in our local parish, as well. It also gives us the opportunity to raise funds for the parish by earning rebates over our own individual diocesan goal. We are only asked once a year to make this special pledge. The Parish Finance Council has recommended, and our Pastor has approved, a 2019 parish goal of \$85,000 with pledges from 674 of our families. Once our diocesan goal of \$38,000 is paid, all additional gifts will be returned to the parish in the form of a rebate to complete our parish projects. This includes two new ADA compliant restrooms. We would like to achieve this goal by December 31, 2019.

It is important you listen to your heart and prayerfully discern how God wants you to use the gifts He has entrusted to your care. You may make your pledge by using the special envelope you receive, or you may go online at www.oc-foundation.org. There are also extra pledge envelopes in the pew racks. Your pledge may be paid all at one time, quarterly or spread out over a ten month period. Any gift you can give will be appreciated. Every pledge is important and no monthly pledge is too small.

Together, we can reach this extraordinary goal!

Parish Faith Formation

WHY GO TO MASS ON SUNDAY?

There are many people today who will be quick to tell you that they are Catholic, but how many of them are actually attending Mass on Sunday? Some may wonder, "Why should I go to Mass at all?"

First of all, we go to Mass because we are spiritually hungry and to receive the help we need to live a Christian life. We hear God's word and are nourished by the Lord's body and blood in the Eucharist. We need God's help to keep going in life and deal with any problems we may have. Active participation at the Eucharist is rewarded by God's grace and help.

Secondly, the 3rd Commandment says to "Keep holy the Sabbath Day." Since earliest times, Christians have observed Sunday as a day of worship and rest in order to honor the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus. The Church teaches that Catholics have a serious obligation to participate in Mass every Sunday and on Holy Days of obligation. Willfully disobeying this precept is seriously sinful, whereas reverent obedience can bring about wonderful blessings in our lives.

Thirdly, by participating in Sunday Eucharist, we become a part of the Christian community where we live or where we happen to be. We are called to enter into relationships with others on our Christian journey through this life to the Father. Active involvement in a broad range of parish activities, beginning with Mass, give great meaning to our lives and provides opportunities for deep, sustaining friendships.

Being in the habit of regular Mass attendance brings with it a spiritual discipline that helps an individual throughout the rest of the week. It is a strong sign of our Catholicity, an anchor to hold on to so that our spiritual values will not be overcome by the materialistic ones.

In the long run, active participation in Sunday Eucharist is the bare minimum for being a good Catholic. Much more is needed if we are to allow our faith to be an intimate part of our lives. However, a Catholic who doesn't participate in Mass every Sunday is a Catholic whose spiritual hunger is not being fed.
