Reflections of the Week

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Today we hear how Abram encounters Melchizedek, king of Salem . . . and a priest of God Most High (Genesis 14:18). Melchizedek appears nowhere else in scripture, but is nonetheless significant. Psalm 110 declares of the great King David, You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek, a description later given (in the letter to the Hebrews) to Christ as High Priest.

Early Christians saw in Melchizedek's bread and wine the bread and wine of the Eucharist; Paul's account of the Last Supper (in today's second reading) is the oldest one in scripture. In the Gospel, Luke describes Jesus providing bread for a crowd in words similar to Paul's, words still used by the Church: Jesus takes bread, gives thanks, breaks it. Together, these three readings reveal how Christian priesthood, Christ's Real Presence, and the call to serve those in need are all found in the gift of the Eucharist.

Do This In Remembrance of Me

We are familiar with the instructions that Jesus gives his disciples at the Last Supper. But what exactly is it that we are to do in remembrance of Jesus? One answer focuses on the institution narrative found in the Eucharistic Prayers: we are to consecrate the bread and wine, changing them, by the power of the Holy Spirit, into the Body and Blood of Christ. This is true; but let's think about what it takes to actually do this, as the Church has done for almost two thousand years:

- * We are to remember Jesus, the Word of God in human form. To do this, we need that other word of God, given in a different form: the words of the scriptures.
- * We need to assemble to do this. The Last Supper is a communal meal with Jesus. In his letter to the Corinthians, Paul describes actions done within a group, actions that began with that communal meal with Jesus. We gather as today's disciples and continue that group activity in our assemblies.
- * We need to find a way to assemble with some degree of order. We need leaders. We need preachers to preach the Word, we need presiders to repeat the actions of Jesus, persons who are ordered--ordained--for preaching and for the consecration of the bread and wine.

Church, Eucharist and Those In Need

There is a saying: The Church makes the Eucharist, and the Eucharist makes the Church. In the Eucharistic celebration, we find Christ truly present in the consecrated bread and wine. We also find him in the assembly, the scriptures, and the preacher-presider--everything we do to do this, and in doing this, we become the Body of Christ. Our Eucharistic remembrance of Jesus is a living sacramental memory that transforms us, too. We receive Communion to live in communion with Christ and one another, to become the real presence of Christ in the world. We do what the disciples did: we feed those in need with the love and compassion with which Christ feeds us.

Membership Drive

The Knights of Columbus of St. Mary's by the Sea needs you! They are having their membership drive out side the Church after all this weekend's Masses. Eucharistic Adoration & Exposition

St. Mary's by the Sea **opens the Church for Eucharistic Adoration every Monday through Friday from 1:00 to 4:30 pm.** On **Thursdays**, the **Divine Mercy Chaplet** will be recited at **3:00pm** and we will have **Eucharistic Exposition** (*where the Blessed Sacrament is displayed outside the tabernacle in the monstrance for adoration by the faithful*) from **3:00 to 7:30 pm**, closing with **Benediction** (*praying the rosary and receiving a blessing with the Host*) at **7:30 pm.**

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

360 Sunday - A Call to Action

Bishop Kevin Vann has declared **Sunday, June 23** as "360 Sunday" in the Diocese of Orange. Bishop Vann is urging all Catholics to make their voices heard and let Sacramento legislators know that they oppose Senate Bill 360, which mandates that clergy report to civil authorities the identities of certain penitents who in the sacrament of penance confess that they have sexually abused a minor.

State law currently exempts clergy from the mandate to report sexual abuse of a minor when that information is learned in the sacrament of penance. Clergy and other mandated reporters who learn of such abuse outside of the rite of penance are required to report the abuse to civil officials. If SB 360 were to pass, Catholic priests would be faced with either violating state law or breaking the seal of confession, a very serious crime that would result in their automatic excommunication. Numerous priests have gone on record stating that they will protect the seal of confession at any cost.

The bill has passed in the State Senate and now moves to the Assembly. It is a violation of religious freedom, going against the First Amendment.

Bishop Vann asks all Catholics to visit www.rcbo.org/360Sunday to learn more about the proposed legislation and then to sign an online petition which will automatically be routed to your Assembly representative.
