Reflections of the Week

Grateful to God

The Gospel makes it pretty clear that exalting yourself is not the way into the Kingdom. So it might sound strange to hear Paul saying he expects the winner's crown. So why is he any different from the Pharisee in the Gospel?

The Pharisee fasted and tithed, was not greedy or adulterous, but he misses the point. He thinks that justification, being right with God, comes from a person's accomplishments. He feels no need to ask for God's mercy. Yet if he relied on that mercy, he wouldn't boast about his good deeds. Instead, he would ask for God's mercy and then thank God by doing good or being generous. In other words, he thinks that God is waiting to be bribed with good deeds so that he can be justified. "After all," thinks the Pharisee, "what else are good deeds for if not to make me look good?"

St. Paul, on the other hand, looks at his life as a Pharisee and is amazed that God forgave his "good works" of keeping the law and persecuting Christians. His boasting is not about what he has done for God; it's more about what God has done through him. In verse 17, he credits God, who gave him the strength to preach the Good News.

Maybe you have examples of what God has done in your life: the people God sent to love you, the talents or abilities God gave you, the times God forgave your sins. Are you so grateful for what God has done that you want to do more for God? Or do you go to church, put your offering in the collection, and work a booth at the parish picnic so that God will be grateful to you? It sounds obvious when put that way, but it is tempting to think that God loves us more when we do good things. Remember that God loved St. Paul while he was still persecuting Christians, loved him enough not only to forgive him but to make him into a great apostle. Why waste your time trying to earn that love, when you could be doing whatever you can to thank God for it?

PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY, TODAY, OCTOBER 27

Today is a special day set aside to honor the priesthood in the United States. It is a day to reflect upon and affirm the role of the priesthood in the life of the Church. Priesthood Sunday sends a message to all that the sins of a few do not reflect the innocent majority, and that the parish priest, as the instrument of Christ's ministry on earth, is loved and respected by those in the parish community. These men serve the needs of the Church – the Body of Christ – by leading people not to themselves, but to the God of Jesus Christ. They console the faithful and guide them. The source of their gift(s) for ordained ministry is given from God for the good of the whole community. Ordained priests enable and empower all of the baptized, despite human weaknesses, to deepen faith, grow in hope, and share the gift of Christ's love with all human persons so that God's glory will be experienced repeatedly.

ALL SAINTS DAY, NOVEMBER 1ST

On November 1st, all consecrated persons who do not have a celebration of their own in the liturgical calendar are venerated, or honored. This celebration is called **All Saints Day** and is a **Holy Day of Obligation**. It is a tradition instituted in honor of all the saints of the Church, known and unknown. According to Pope Urban IV, this feast was to make up for any feast that might have been missing for these holy people. As such, individuals throughout the Church Universal are honored, in addition to individuals who have personally led one to faith in Jesus, such as one's grandmother or friend.
