Reflections of the Week

A couple of weeks ago we heard the story of the multiplication of the loaves and fish. Jesus transformed a meager amount of food to a meal that satisfied thousands. Today we hear him tell the disciples that “the harvest is abundant” (Luke 10:2). As God provided abundant milk and overflowing prosperity to Jerusalem in Isaiah, Jesus provided abundant food and now an abundant harvest to the people. So too does God’s grace continue to overflow into our world. Jesus is not only the Bread of Life, satisfying our hunger with his own Body and Blood, he is our redeemer, abundantly sharing forgiveness throughout humankind. Our harvest of spiritual sustenance and redemption is indeed plentiful.

In last week’s Gospel, Jesus specifically told his disciples not to retaliate. Last Sunday he rebuked James and John when they wanted to call down fire from heaven to destroy the Samaritan village that refused to welcome him. Today he tells the disciples to move on if they are rejected. He instructs them to offer peace wherever they go. Unlike money, which he specifically told them not to bring, the peace the disciples did bring could be given again and again, and when it was not received it returned to them.

This episode from the Gospel can be considered a dress rehearsal. Jesus sent out seventy-two disciples, a number thought to be the total number of nations on earth, to bring peace, cure the sick, and proclaim the kingdom. After his resurrection, Jesus called upon the disciples to be his witnesses to the ends of the earth, making disciples of every nation. The disciples were able to do it because they had rehearsed it then. Today we are the ones who are called to the mission, to the harvest, to bring peace, comfort, understanding, and forgiveness to people around the world. Peace, not discord, is what we should sow so that at harvest time we, too, can return rejoicing.

Parts of the Mass

THE LORD’S PRAYER

The Eucharistic Prayer ends with the great “Amen,” the acclamation of assent by the assembly. Then the Communion rite begins with the Lord’s Prayer. We pray this prayer in many contexts, both inside and outside the Church’s liturgy. Here, in the context of the Mass, the Lord’s Prayer is profoundly Eucharistic. When we ask for our “daily bread,” we are asking for the gift of the Eucharist. When we ask God to forgive us as we forgive others, we are seeking forgiveness and purity of heart before we approach the altar to receive the sacrament of the Lord’s Body and Blood—“so that what is holy may, in fact, be given to those who are holy” (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 81).

At Mass, a prayer for peace is inserted between the prayer and the doxology. In this prayer, called the embolism, the Church asks God for freedom—freedom from sin and all anxiety and distress. We are living in an in-between time; even as we rejoice in Christ’s presence, we await his coming in joyful hope.
