

Reflections of the Week

Our culture tends to value displays of strength and often associates strength with the use of force. In moments of hurt or injury, we may feel justified in fighting back or seeking revenge. However, as Christians, we are called to exhibit a different response: one of nonviolent resistance. We need to turn the other cheek and refuse to let our emotions control our actions.

Anger and hatred can fester within us, poisoning our hearts and leading us to harmful actions. While some may argue that releasing these emotions is the answer, such actions only escalate the situation and do not overcome the negative emotions within us. As Jesus reminds us, we are called to cleanse our hearts of such negative emotions and to replace them with the determination to be reconciled with one another and to love one another.

As Catholics, we are called to be holy, just as our heavenly Father is perfect. This may seem like an impossible task, but we must remember that we are created in the image of God and that the Holy Spirit dwells within us. Although we have all sinned, we are still temples of God, and God desires that we allow the Spirit within us to shine through our sinfulness. By living our lives in accordance with God's will, we can strive towards holiness and perfection.

Let us all pray for the grace to be countercultural and to exhibit the inner strength to turn the other cheek, to replace hatred with love, and to strive towards holiness and perfection. May the Holy Spirit guide us on this journey and may we always seek to glorify God in all that we do.

Lenten Regulations

- 1. It is to be noted first of all that it is by Divine Law that the faithful are bound to do penance and, as a specification of this obligation by the Church, some form of mortification by those 14 years of age and older is to be observed on all Fridays throughout the year. This obligation is itself a serious one.
- 2. Everyone 14 years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent.
- 3. Everyone who is at least 18 years of age and not yet 60 is bound also to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

a. On these two days of fast, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals on these days is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

b. Where health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
