

## Reflections of the Week

Today's Gospel reading from Luke tells us the beautiful story of the two disciples who were walking on the road to Emmaus. These two disciples were feeling sad and confused after Jesus' death, and as they walked, they were joined by a stranger who they didn't recognize as the risen Christ. The stranger listened to their story and then proceeded to explain the scriptures to them, starting from Moses and all the prophets, until their hearts burned within them.

But it wasn't until they broke bread with the stranger that their eyes were opened, and they recognized him as Jesus. The breaking of bread is a significant moment in this story because it foreshadows the Eucharist, which we celebrate every time we come together as a community.

In the Eucharist, we, too, encounter the risen Christ, just as the disciples did on the road to Emmaus. When we receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we become united with Him, and we are strengthened to go out into the world and continue His mission.

But this story is not just about the Eucharist. It is also a reminder that Christ is with us always, even in our darkest moments. When we are feeling lost or confused, we can turn to Christ, who will always be with us, even if we don't recognize Him at first.

As we continue to celebrate the Easter season, let us be reminded of the hope and joy that comes with the resurrection of Christ. Let us continue to break bread together as a community and be nourished by the Body and Blood of Christ. And let us always be open to encountering Christ in unexpected ways, just as the two disciples did on the road to Emmaus.

May the risen Christ be with us always, and may we continue to proclaim His message of love and hope to all those we encounter.

### The Eucharist

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The term "Eucharist" originates from the Greek word eucharistia, meaning thanksgiving.

In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. The whole Christ is truly present -- body, blood, soul, and divinity -- under the appearances of bread and wine, the glorified Christ who rose from the dead. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

#### Is the Eucharist mentioned in the Bible?

The Lord Jesus, on the night before he suffered on the cross, shared one last meal with his disciples. During this meal our Savior instituted the sacrament of his Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the ages and to entrust to the Church a memorial of his death and resurrection. The Institution of the Eucharist is written down in the four Gospels below:

- **+** Matthew 26:26-30
- Mark 14:22-26
- + Luke 22:14-20
- **+** John 6:22-59 (The Bread of Life Discourse)
