

## **Reflections of the Week**

The events leading up to Jesus' crucifixion are filled with irony and lessons for us today. The crowd's behavior towards Jesus in Jerusalem reveals how people's expectations and desires can influence their actions. They hailed Jesus as a conquering hero, throwing cloaks and branches on the road before him, but turned on him when they realized he did not meet their expectations of a political Messiah. This led to Jesus' ultimate victory over sin and death through his sacrificial death on the cross, which established a new covenant bound by his own blood.

Throughout Matthew's Gospel, Jesus is portrayed as the new Moses, leading his people to the promised land of eternal life. His teachings, arranged in five discourses, are like a new Torah. Jesus' connection to the Jewish lineage, his familiarity with their laws and traditions, and his ultimate sacrifice make him the ultimate liberator from the slavery of sin.

However, the events leading to Jesus' death also reveal the danger of mob mentality. The anonymity and support of a crowd can lead people to do things they would not otherwise do, as seen in the betraval of Judas and the condemnation of Jesus by the crowd. It is important to be aware of this dynamic and take responsibility for our actions, rather than going along with the crowd.

Finally, Jesus' call for us to carry our own crosses is a call to give of ourselves for the benefit of others, just as he gave of himself for us. We are challenged to see Jesus in our neighbor in need and ease their burdens, returning in some small way the debt we owe to him who gave his life for us.
