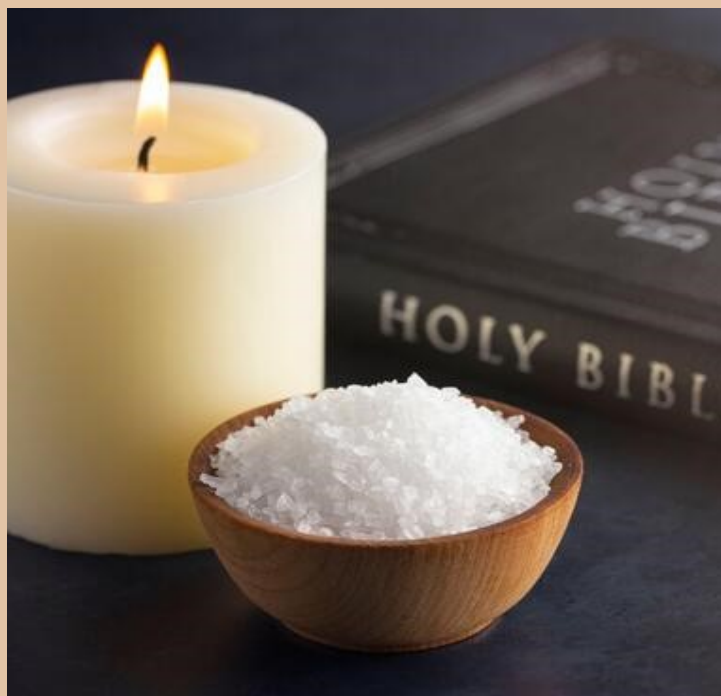

Reflections of the Week

St. Paul emphasized repeatedly in his letters to the early Christian communities that it was the message of the gospel, not the messenger, that was spreading and inspiring faith all across the Mediterranean. While St. Paul himself could not be in one place for an extended time or be everywhere at once, the message of the gospel and the guidance of the Holy Spirit could remain with the communities and be present everywhere. As a result, these Christian communities became shining examples of the power, love, and mercy of Christ for all to see. May our Catholic community do the same.

In keeping with this message, last week we heard Jesus teach the Beatitudes, blessing those who embody certain virtues. By combining this message with St. Paul's teachings, we can understand our calling to be a light to others, shining the lessons of the Beatitudes like a lamp on a stand. By choosing to make peace and avoiding conflict, we can inspire others to do the same. By witnessing to our faith in eternal life through a merciful God, we can bring comfort to those who mourn. And by working for justice and righteousness, we can inspire others who share these ideals. Let us live out the Beatitudes openly, so that others may see their worth and follow in our footsteps.

As Jesus tells his disciples, we are the light of the world, reflecting the light of Christ who also claimed to be the light of the world and promised that those who follow him will have the light of life. At our baptism, we were given a candle lit from the Easter candle, symbolizing that we are to always walk in the light of Christ. Throughout our lives, we should be mindful of this flame in our hearts and reflect it to the world, shining into the shadows of sin and injustice, poverty, and evil. May Christ's light dispel these shadows and guide us always.

Please remember that anointing of the sick is a sacrament of the Church and is offered to Catholics who are dangerously ill due to sickness, injury, or old age. The sacrament is for serious mental or emotional illness as well. While we should not be excessively concerned about the degree of seriousness of the condition, the casual participation in the sacrament must be avoided in good conscience.
