## Reflections of the Week

Just over a month ago, we encountered the powerful account of two disciples walking to their town of Emmaus, bewildered by the reports that Jesus' body was no longer in the tomb. They were joined by a stranger on the road, whom they did not recognize. It was only during the breaking of the bread that their eyes were opened, and they exclaimed, "Were not our hearts burning within us?" (Luke 24:32). This encounter holds a profound significance, as shortly after, the Holy Spirit manifested to the disciples as tongues of fire in the upper room. The purpose of this divine mission we are entrusted with is to ignite a fire within us, compelling us to witness and act upon the love and mercy of God every day.

We must understand that the way in which we express our testimony to the workings of the Spirit within us will vary, as the Apostle Paul eloquently states, "There are different workings, but the same God who produces all of them in everyone" (1 Corinthians 12:6). Though blessed with diverse gifts and called to different forms of service, we are united in serving the same God. In our communities there may be disagreements and divisions, however, we should recognize that our shared common ground surpasses our differences, for each one of us possesses the Holy Spirit within, endowing us with unique gifts that we express in our own distinctive ways.

According to the passage from John's Gospel, when Jesus first appeared to his disciples after his resurrection, he bestowed upon them two essential gifts: the Holy Spirit and peace. In that upper room, the disciples, overwhelmed by fear and uncertainty, locked themselves away, fearing persecution, grappling with the sorrow of Jesus' crucifixion, questioning the testimonies they had heard, burdened by guilt for abandoning their Lord, and anxious about what lay ahead. Thus, the first gift Jesus offered them was peace—a peace that calmed their minds and hearts. Subsequently, he presented them with another gift: a mission. He entrusted them with the task of bringing peace and mercy to the world. The peace and forgiveness they received, along with the Holy Spirit, were not meant to be confined within the locked room. As modern-day disciples, we too are called to carry forth the mantle of peace, mercy, and the Holy Spirit into the world.

In essence, all three readings converge to illuminate our purpose as followers of Christ. We are commissioned to be bearers of the flame, ignited by the Spirit, and driven by the peace bestowed upon us. Our mission is to witness to the love and mercy of God, transcending our differences and embracing the diverse gifts granted to each one of us.

#### **Memorial Day**


