

Reflections of the Week

In today's readings, we are reminded of our role as followers of Jesus Christ and the importance of serving one another. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we see the early Christian community faced with a problem of unequal distribution of food among the Greek-speaking and Hebrew-speaking members. The apostles recognized the problem and appointed seven men to serve and ensure that everyone received their fair share. This act of service not only resolved the issue but also strengthened the unity of the community.

In the second reading from the first letter of Peter, we are reminded that we are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, and God's own people. We are called to proclaim the mighty acts of God and to live as a holy people. Through our baptism, we are united with Christ and are called to share in his mission of bringing

salvation to the world.

In the Gospel reading from John, Jesus tells his disciples that he is the way, the truth, and the life, and that no one comes to the Father except through him. Jesus also reminds us that we are capable of doing the same works that he does and even greater works because he is going to the Father. Jesus is calling us to be his hands and feet in the world, to continue his work of spreading love, mercy, and compassion.

These readings remind us that as followers of Christ, we are called to be of service to one another, to live as a holy people, and to continue Christ's work in the world. We are called to be Christ-like in all that we do and to bring Christ's light to the world. In a world that is filled with darkness, we are called to be beacons of hope, love, and joy. Let us pray for the grace to live our lives in service to one another and to fulfill our mission of being Christ's ambassadors in the world.
