

Reflections of the Week

In Isaiah's plea for divine intervention, the call to "rend the heavens and come down" echoes through time, anticipating the rescue of those who have strayed and a transformation of stubborn hearts. For Christians, Jesus is God's response to Isaiah's prayer. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, diligently pursues the lost, and as a teacher, imparts lessons of mercy and forgiveness. In essence, Jesus is the ultimate Christmas gift, sent by God for the redemption of all.

A few weeks ago we heard the parable of the ten virgins waiting for the bridegroom, five who foolishly brought no oil with them for their lamps. Just as some virgins wisely planned ahead with enough oil for their lamps, the servants in today's Gospel exhibit readiness for the master's return. This readiness, however, extends beyond the confines of December 25. The Lord comes in different ways to different folks, not just as an infant child on Christmas Day. Thus, our period of preparation is ongoing—whether the Lord arrives today or years from now, our readiness remains crucial.

In drawing a connection between the two narratives, each servant in today's Gospel has a distinct role and workload, mirroring the diversity of tasks and timelines in our own lives. Instead of comparing ourselves to our neighbors, who may have different challenges and responsibilities, the emphasis is on offering help and support. In essence, the call is to unite in readiness, recognizing the uniqueness of our individual journeys while fostering a spirit of assistance and understanding in our shared preparation for the divine arrival.

Why Have Eucharistic Adoration?

8. Should priests encourage the faithful to pray before the Blessed Sacrament?

Pope Paul VI urged that the faithful should not forget about paying a visit during the day to the Most Blessed Sacrament in the very special place of honor where it is reserved in churches in keeping with the liturgical laws, since this is a proof of gratitude and a pledge of love and a display of the adoration that is owed to Christ the Lord who is present there. Pastors should see that churches and public oratories where, according to law, the holy Eucharist is reserved, are open every day at least for some hours, at a convenient time, so that the faithful may easily pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.




