Reflections of the Week

Sometimes God's voice comes out of the clouds loud and clear, as when Jesus is baptized. But when God calls one of us, it is often soft and unclear, as it is in today's first reading. Only after twice mistaking God's voice for his guardian Eli's does Samuel respond to the LORD, and only then because Eli realized what must be happening. Much later, Elijah has a similar experience when he hears God's voice in a tiny whispering sound. There was no fanfare when Jesus called for Andrew and his friend to come and follow. We should not wait till we are thrown to the ground like Paul or hear a thunderous voice from the clouds like Moses. God often calls in faint and subtle ways.

Andrew clearly was enthralled with the Lord, for he stayed all day with him and recognized him as the Messiah. He could have stayed the night and chosen not to share Jesus' attention with anyone else. But he didn't. Late that afternoon he sought out his brother, told him that they had found the Messiah and brought him to Jesus. The invitation we receive is meant to be shared.

Disagreements happen: differences of opinion or seemingly irreconcilable conflicts, and two people or two groups stop speaking to each other. Years go by and they end up forgetting how it came to this. Centuries go by and we wonder how we ever became separated. When Jesus called out, "Come, and you will see" (John 1:39), he did not lead his disciples to different places following different pathways. During this upcoming week of prayer for Christian unity, we would be wise to keep in mind that Jesus calls each of us to follow him and work to find a unified response to that call.

In many places, this exposition takes place for a period of "forty hours," during which the faithful join with local clergy in a continuous period of prayer for forty hours. In other places, shorter periods of continuous prayer before the exposed Blessed Sacrament take place, accompanied by appropriate sacred songs, readings from Scripture, and other forms of liturgical prayer.

Fortune Tellers

An increasingly popular form of entertainment has been occurring: people seeking comfort and assurance from the dead about their life to come. For Christians, the knowledge that our future is safe in the hands of God should be enough. Jesus paid dearly to give us that assurance and to seek it from any other source is sinful.

God's word is very clear on this subject: "Let there not be found among you anyone who causes their son or daughter to pass through the fire, or practices divination, or is a soothsayer, augur, or sorcerer, or who casts spells, consults ghosts and spirits, or seeks oracles from the dead. Anyone who does such things is an abomination to the LORD, and because of such abominations the LORD, your God, is dispossessing them before you" (Deuteronomy 18:10-12).

The first commandment forbids all dealing with the devil and superstitious practices, such as consulting spiritualists and fortune tellers and trusting in charms, omens, dreams and such like fooleries.

In the light of this growing search for psychic knowledge and phenomena with its resultant disturbance of peace and mind, we need to be given more specific teaching of the subject, especially with our young people.

The fact needs to be recognized that it is the devil who is the motivating force, his counterfeit gifts deceive us. The people being used by him need our prayers, their obvious warmth and desire to give comfort are being used by the evil one.

JESUS GETS BAPTIZED, TOO?

When Jesus' cousin John the Baptist spotted Jesus the Messiah coming to be baptized, he said, "Behold the Lamb of God." Bishop Barron helps us understand the important historical contexts as follows:

"No first-century Israelite would have missed the meaning of that: behold the one who has come to be sacrificed. Behold the sacrifice, which will sum up, complete, and perfect the Temple. Moreover, behold the Passover lamb, who sums up the whole meaning of that event and brings it to fulfillment... The preparatory work of Israel is over, and now the Messiah will reign."

How grand is the arrival of the long-awaited Christ! There has never been anyone in recorded history whose birth and life were anticipated for centuries by God-sent prophets and priests. Of course, Jesus, as we know, is not ordinary, but He became one with us that His arrival is sometimes overlooked.

John the Baptist facilitated the baptism of repentance, but what is there to repent in our pure and perfect God, who took on human flesh in Jesus? He chose to be baptized in the same river where his brothers and sisters made resolutions to let go of their sinful past and be faithful to God. (Doesn't it sound like what we hear when we receive ashes at the beginning of Lent?) As humans, we often forget our baptismal promises and need to be reminded of our beliefs and firmly attest to that with our lives:

- V. Do you reject Satan?
- V. And all his works?
- V. And all his empty promises?

V. Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth?

V. Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary was crucified, died, and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father? V. Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

Baptism makes us members of the Body of Christ. ... "to be a holy priesthood" (1 Peter 2:5). By Baptism they share in the priesthood of Christ, in his prophetic and royal mission. They are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people ..." (1 Peter 2:9). *Baptism gives a share in the common priesthood of all believers (CCC*, 1267, 1268).
