PORTRAIT OF THE DIVINE KING

"This is our King, the King of the Universe, for He journeyed to the furthest confines of our human experience, entered into the black hole of hatred and abandonment, in order to bring light to every life and embrace all of reality."

Pope Francis reminds us that the Lord gave the gift of Himself entirely, offering His life in service, revealing God's loving closeness to each one of us. "This is the King whom we acclaim." We are invited to ask ourselves: Is the Lord, the King of the Universe, also the King of our own lives? If not, then what is? Can that very thing love us unconditionally and die on our behalf?

In gazing upon the crucified Jesus, we see that His open arms are a loving invitation for all of us—no matter our status, history, or failings—to receive His love and allow our lives to be transformed.

Invitation: What is keeping you from investing this short earthly life for the eternal happiness with God? Take a moment to list just three things that are most important to you. Is God in the picture? Does your attitude and response testify that God is first priority in your life? Some may find God's demand burdensome: "You shall not have other gods besides me." Some have been misled into thinking that God is selfish. But He is not; He is merciful. When we seek other, finite gods, we fail to recognize the infinite God of the Universe who is seeking us. Once the King finds you (and you allow yourself to be found), you will be on His shoulders—and as Jesus says, heaven will rejoice.



ADORATION: THE PERFECT GIFT OF PRESENCE TO THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE

12-Hour First Friday Adoration In December, the Church honors Christ and Mary his Mother with two great feasts: the Immaculate Conception and Christmas. By far the best way that we can prepare for both special days is to spend time with Our Lord. Come to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament on Friday, December 6th, from 9am to 9pm. Slow down and simply be in deep communion with God. Tell Jesus "I am ready for You, Lord, to descend into my heart and make your home there."

PREPARING FOR ADVENT COMING UP

Let's reflect on how Mother Teresa honored Jesus' Kingship. She was inspired to live a simple lifestyle among the poor, with the goal of serving and lifting them up. Actually, all services are not simply for



others but sole for JESUS in the poor. In the chapel of her community, you won't find chairs, pews, or kneelers. Why? Simplicity. This humble setting helps the nuns identify themselves with their beloved Spouse, Jesus Christ. At the center of the chapel, a large crucifix hangs behind the altar, with stark words painted in bold, black capital letters on the wall beside it: "I THIRST." What do you "thirst" for? Let Christ quench it this upcoming holy season of Advent. Here are some suggestions to prepare a holy crib for our Savior, to let Christ in this upcoming CHRISTMAS:

- ◆Decorate the house all things Advent (violet)
- ◆Post up quotes, images, reflections related to this season
- ◆Set aside a definite time for prayer/family faith sharing
- •Read the sections of the Bible related to Jesus' incarnation & practice silence and attentive listening.
- *Light an Advent wreath at the beginning of each week

ST. ANDREW CHRISTMAS NOVENA

The single prayer of the St. Andrew Christmas Novena is traditionally prayed fifteen times each day, beginning on the feast of St. Andrew (November 30) and concluding on Christmas Eve.

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother. Amen.

Name any intentions or other prayers you wish to share with God. Maybe consider your response to Jesus's call to follow Him; just as he called on Andrew and Peter, he also calls on us to let go and surrender.

EUCHARIST=THANKSGIVING

Do you know that "Eucharist" in Greek means thanksgiving? The wondrous act of thanksgiving was wrapped up in the thanksgiving offered by Christ at the Last Supper. "The Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me'" (1 Cor. 11:23-24). Jesus does not give himself to us until he has given thanks.

Our country has continued to celebrate the day as a national holiday since that time in 1863. Though President Lincoln began the national tradition 161 years ago, his declaration followed a long tradition of setting aside a Thursday to give thanks to God that was begun by George Washington in 1789.
