

Reflections of the Week

Today we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord, a feast that marks both a conclusion and a new beginning—a moment of departure, but also one of empowerment and mission.

In our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we witness a dramatic and awe-inspiring scene: Jesus, having spent 40 days with His disciples after the Resurrection, ascends into heaven before their very eyes. He leaves them with a promise—that they will soon receive the power of the Holy Spirit—and with a mission: to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth.

The Gospel from Luke gives us an intimate glimpse into Jesus' final moments with His disciples. He opens their minds to the Scriptures, reminding them that the suffering, death, and Resurrection were always part of God's plan. Then, with hands lifted in blessing, He is taken up to heaven. But notice the response of the disciples—they return to Jerusalem with great joy, continually praising God.

Joy. Praise. Mission. These are not the reactions of people who have just experienced a loss. They are the marks of people who have been filled with hope, empowered by a promise, and entrusted with a purpose.

And that's where St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians comes in. He prays that we may have a spirit of wisdom and revelation to know Christ more deeply-to understand the hope to which we are called and the power available to us through Christ. Paul reminds us that Jesus, now seated at the right hand of the Father, is far above every authority, and that He is the Head of the Church, His body.

In other words, the Ascension is not about Jesus leaving us behind. It's about Jesus taking His place as King of the Universe and drawing us into His divine life and mission. He ascends not to abandon us, but to send us out—with the promise of His Spirit and the assurance of His presence through the Church.

This means we are not spectators of a distant event. We are participants in an ongoing mission. Christ now reigns in glory, but He continues His work on earth through us—through His body, the Church.

We, like the apostles, are called to move forward. We are witnesses to the Resurrection. We are heralds of hope. And we are empowered, not by our own strength, but by the same Spirit that Jesus promised to His first disciples.

As we await the feast of Pentecost, let us pray for that same outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Let us ask for the grace to understand the hope of our calling, the richness of our inheritance, and the immeasurable greatness of God's power working in us who believe.

THE ASCENSION

The Ascension of Christ marks the completion of His earthly ministry and His glorious entrance into heaven, where He now reigns and intercedes for us. But it also signifies the beginning of His heavenly ministry—preparing a place for believers and sending us the Holy Spirit to empower the Church

Spirit to empower the Church.
So how are we invited to respond to this great mystery? The ascended Christ gives each of us, His disciples, gifts of the Holy Spirit to build up the Church (Ephesians 4:7–12). How is this seen in our daily lives? Is it through building up our domestic Church—our families—with ever-living faith and joyful witness to the Good News? Is it by immersing ourselves in the love of Christ during Mass, and then living out the mission each week to become more like Him?

These are important questions to ponder as we approach Pentecost, the celebration of the Spirit poured out upon the Church. And sometimes, inspiration can even come through unexpected ways—like sports! In two weeks (6/13), there will be a basketball match between priests and seminarians (https://www.rcbo.org/basketball/). Could this fun event also be a reminder that we are all called to encourage young people to encounter Christ and explore His unique calling for them, especially in the priesthood and religious life?

The deeper question remains: Does the Ascension truly impact our lives? Have we allowed it to stir in us a sense of mission? Or could it be that we haven't yet shed tears or made sacrifices for the Gospel—and that's why we may not feel as "Easterly alive" as we could?

Bring this to prayer.

Ask Jesus to empower you through His Holy Spirit. Allow Him to make you a vitamin boost of growth—bringing strength, joy, and renewal to our local and universal Church. Christ has ascended—but He has not left us. He now works in and through us. Let us rise with Him and take up the mission He entrusts to us (Eph 4: 7-12).



"As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete." (John 15: 9-11)

2025 National Eucharistic Pilgrimage

As part of the three-year NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL in the United States, the Diocese of Orange is honored to host pilgrims traveling the St. KATHARINE DREXEL ROUTE that will pass through our diocese on June 18 to 20. All ages and walks of life are welcome to this extraordinary opportunity to encounter Jesus with daily Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, Eucharistic processions and witness talks. Here in Orange County, it will start at Our Lady of Fatima parish and end at Christ Cathedral.

The following is where the Drexel Route is passing through in our diocese:

- 1. **June 18:** Our Lady of Fatima, JSerra High School, Mission Basilica San Juan Capistrano (overnight)
- 2. **June 19:** St. Thomas More, Holy Family (Orange), St. John Maron, Christ Cathedral (overnight)
- 3. **June 20:** Transfer to the Archdiocese of Los Angeles in the morning

The **St. Katharine Drexel Route** begins with a Mass of Thanksgiving in Indianapolis on Sunday, May 18, and will culminate in Los Angeles on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ on Sunday, June 22. The Blessed Sacrament will travel through parts of the Midwest, Texas, and along the Southwestern United States before reaching the Diocese of Orange.
