

Reflections of the Week

In the first reading, the early Church faces a crisis of division as some Jewish Christians insist that Gentile believers must follow Mosaic Law to be saved. After much debate, the apostles and elders in Jerusalem, guided by the Holy Spirit, affirm that salvation is through grace, not through the Law. They send a letter encouraging unity and simplicity in faith, highlighting only essential practices. This moment marks a critical turning point where the Church chooses inclusion, guided by divine wisdom and communal discernment.

And as the Bible nears its conclusion, Jesus speaks with finality and urgency: "Behold, I am coming soon." He promises rewards for the faithful and describes the blessing of those who "wash their robes," symbolizing purity and access to the Tree of Life. The Spirit and the Bride echo the great invitation: "Come!" All who thirst are welcomed freely. Christ's imminent return is both a call to readiness and an assurance of hope.

Finally, in His priestly prayer, Jesus prays not only for His disciples but for all who will believe in Him. His deepest desire is unity—"that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you." Jesus links this unity to the divine love shared within the Trinity, offering believers a profound participation in that love and glory. The prayer ends with a longing: that His followers may be with Him and behold His glory.

Together, all these scriptures form a mosaic of the early Church's mission, Christ's love, and the believer's eternal hope. They call the Church today to continue in unity, guided by the Spirit, deeply rooted in love, and always ready for the return of the Lord.

2025 National Eucharistic Pilgrimage



All ages and walks of life are welcome to this extraordinary opportunity to encounter Jesus with daily Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, Eucharistic processions and witness talks. Here in Orange County, it will start at Our Lady of Fatima parish and end at Christ Cathedral.

The following is where the DREXEL ROUTE is passing through in our diocese:

- 1. **June 18:** Our Lady of Fatima, JSerra High School, Mission Basilica San Juan Capistrano (overnight)
- 2. **June 19:** St. Thomas More, Holy Family (Orange), St. John Maron, Christ Cathedral (overnight)
- 3. **June 20:** Transfer to the Archdiocese of Los Angeles in the morning

The **St. Katharine Drexel Route** begins with a Mass of Thanksgiving in Indianapolis on Sunday, May 18, and will culminate in Los Angeles on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ on Sunday, June 22. The Blessed Sacrament will travel through parts of the Midwest, Texas, and along the Southwestern United States before reaching the Diocese of Orange.



Happy Easter!

It may sound strange to hear "Happy Easter" when Easter Sunday was over six weeks ago. But the truth is, this glorious and most important feast of the Christian year cannot be celebrated in just one day. The Easter season is so significant that it spans fifty days—from Easter Sunday to



Pentecost—and invites us to fully enter into its mystery and meaning.

This sacred season highlights three major events that followed the Passion and death of Christ:

The Resurrection – Jesus rose from the dead, triumphing over sin and death and winning for us the gift of salvation. Jesus remained with His followers to reassure them of His abiding presence and prepare them for their mission. The Ascension and Pentecost – After ascending into heaven, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit at Pentecost to empower His disciples to carry out His mission on earth.

Let us take this time to reflect more deeply on the joy, power, and promise of Easter—not just as a single day, but as a life-changing season of grace. Jesus has given us a **personal Counselor—the Holy Spirit**—to be our guide, our helper, and even our divine "Secretary." The Holy Spirit enables us to remember and live out Jesus life and mission courageously and joyfully.
