Reflections of the Week

Today we celebrate the great Solemnity of Corpus Christi—the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. It is a day when the Church invites us to contemplate the deep mystery and profound gift of the Eucharist—the source and summit of our Christian life.

In our first reading, we meet the mysterious figure of Melchizedek, king of Salem and priest of God Most High. He brings out bread and wine and blesses Abram with the very elements Christ will take up at the Last Supper, and through which He will offer His own Body and Blood. This brief scene is rich with meaning. Melchizedek appears suddenly, offering a sacred meal and a blessing. There is no context for his priesthood, yet he is honored as a priest forever, as Psalm 110 will later affirm: "You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek."

In the second reading, Saint Paul hands on what was given to him: the account of the Last Supper. This is the moment when Jesus transforms the Passover meal into a new covenant—not sealed in the blood of lambs, but in His own blood. Jesus does not say, "This represents my body." He says, "This is my body... this is my blood." In the Eucharist, Christ gives Himself entirely. Each Mass is not a re-enactment, but a real sharing in His one sacrifice. We are nourished with real spiritual food - not mere bread and wine, but the very presence of Jesus Christ.

And in Luke's Gospel, Jesus sees the crowds and has compassion on them. He teaches, heals, and then feeds them. The disciples see the problem—too many people, too little food. But Jesus sees an opportunity. With just five loaves and two fish, He blesses, breaks, and gives—and there is more than enough. Blessed, broken, given. It is the pattern of the Eucharist. It is the shape of Christ's love. He takes the little we offer—our tiredness, our hunger, our doubts—and turns it into a feast. In this miracle, we see a sign of the Eucharist, which continues to multiply grace and unite the Church across the world.

The Eucharist is not just something we attend—it is something we become. We are to be Eucharistic people—blessed, broken, and given for others. In a world starving for meaning, community, and truth, the Eucharist is the answer. It is the real presence of God's love. Let us approach it with reverence, receive it with joy, and live it with conviction.
