

Reflections of the Week

It is unlikely that there is an actual stream of water flowing out from this church we worship in. If there is, we may need to look for a busted pipe! But as we leave this celebration of the Eucharist today, we can be that life-giving water flowing from this church building. Since the Spirit of God dwells in us, we are able to bring the presence of God from this gathering to whomever we encounter throughout the week. On this day when we celebrate the dedication of the mother church built in Rome, we rededicate ourselves to building up the kingdom of God here in the shadow of our own parish church, aware that both celebrate their foundation in Jesus Christ.

At this time in our country, shifting demographics, shrinking Mass attendance, and other factors have led to many church buildings closing or consolidating. This has been emotionally difficult for many faithful. Today's feast can remind us of two things. First of all, no matter what building we gather in, we are still part of the universal church, a Church that began with no buildings at all and lasted centuries before members could worship publicly. Secondly, as Saint Paul reminds us, we are God's building. We are each a temple of God, with a foundation in Jesus Christ and the Spirit of God dwelling in us. May we see in both ourselves and our neighbor that holiness that comes from God's presence within.

In today's Gospel, Jesus refers to his body as a temple, confusing the authorities because they assume that he is speaking of destroying the Jewish temple. But keep in mind that this dialogue occurs after another action of Jesus': the cleansing of the temple of whatever didn't belong. We too must clean the temples of our bodies from whatever doesn't belong, for instance the "marketplace" of our secular culture, which judges everything by its material worth. Since this way of thinking can unconsciously seep into our lives, we are challenged today to cleanse ourselves of making financial matters our overriding priority. After all, if we are temples of God, we should not have "marketplaces" within us.

Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

The Lateran Basilica in Rome, the only church building whose dedication is celebrated as a feast, is an enduring symbol of the universal church. Inscribed on its façade is "omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput," meaning, "mother and head of all the churches of the city and of the world." Originally completed in 324 CE, soon after Emperor Constantine legalized Christianity, the Lateran Basilica is a sign of the triumph of the faithful who survived underground for generations when Christians were persecuted. Although we likely are gathered in a much humbler setting today, we are nonetheless inextricably linked to this historic church—our mother church.

Ministries within the Church often provide avenues for parishioners to volunteer their skills, fostering a vibrant and active faith community.

Treasure

The stewardship of treasure involves the prudent and generous use of financial resources. This aspect of stewardship calls Catholics to support the Church and charitable causes. Tithing, or giving a portion of one's income to the Church, is a traditional practice that reflects trust in God's providence and a commitment to the faith community. Beyond tithing, Catholics are encouraged to practice generosity and simplicity, avoiding materialism and ensuring that wealth is used to uplift the poor and marginalized.

Rite of Acceptance and Welcoming

Next Sunday, November 16, at the 9am Mass, the OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) Candidates will be introduced to the parish and warmly welcomed by our faith family for the first time.

The Catechumen will stand at the entrance of the church as our pastor, Fr. Chu, invites them to introduce themselves and share what they are seeking from the Church. They then publicly declare their intention to continue their journey of faith toward full communion with the Catholic Church. Our parish community responds with prayer, support, and joyful encouragement.

The Rite of Acceptance is for the *Catechumens*—those who have not yet been baptized. The Rite of Welcoming is for those who have already been baptized in another Christian denomination, or for baptized Catholics who have not yet received the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. We also welcome Catholics returning home seeking deeper connection with the Body of Christ and to deepen their Catholic identity and commitment to our Lord.

Since September, these brothers and sisters have been gathering regularly with the OCIA team. The OCIA Catechumens and Candidates are a powerful witness to us all. Their dedication and desire to become fully initiated Catholics remind us of the precious gift of faith we have received from God—and how He continually calls each of us to grow in that faith throughout our lives.

We continue to appreciate your prayers for our brothers and sisters continue to yield tremendous grace for them during in their spiritual journey of faith.

Testimony to Grace and Peace

We invite all those participating in our OCIA program to reflect on what moved them to commit themselves to faith formation in the Catholic Church. Here is one of their heartfelt responses:

"I attended Mass for the first time, and I was deeply moved by what I experienced during the Eucharist. As the bells rang, I felt an overwhelming sense of peace—it was the Real Presence of Jesus Christ! I had been lost, but now I have found my way. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, I have made it safely 'home' to Catholicism."
