Reflections of the Week

In Matthew's Gospel, when Jesus speaks to his disciples about the last judgment, his words sound very much like Isaiah's do today. In both cases, we are told to share what we have with those in need. In fact, both Isaiah and Jesus specifically mention feeding the hungry and clothing the naked. However, Jesus adds another dimension. Jesus teaches us that when we do so, we're not just doing it for that person in need, we are doing it for him. He challenges us to see him in the person in need. In responding to their need, Isaiah tells us, our light will overcome the darkness. That light will also illuminate the face of Jesus in the person whose need we are satisfying.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus tells his disciples that while he is in the world, he is the light of the world and his disciples are the light of the world. We are called to be that light now. However, Jesus is actually still in the world. We incarnate Jesus when we act as he did, caring for those in need. Jesus is also present in that person in need, as he taught his disciples in the context of the last judgment. Finally, the Lord is present in the act of generosity itself. An act of charity reflects the gift of the Lord that we have received from God.

In most cases, if we give something away, we no longer have that thing. Giving food or clothing or money means our pantry or closet or bank account has less. But there are exceptions. One is light. When we open a door or window shade to allow light to spread, the light doesn't get dimmer by its source. When we light someone else's candle with our own, our own candle remains just as bright. Putting a light in a bushel basket does not "conserve" the light. Putting it on a lampstand widens the lit area. Spreading light does not diminish its intensity or brightness at all. Another exception is love. Treating someone else with love does not exhaust our supply even one little bit; in fact, acts of love multiply the love within us and in the world, engendering more and greater acts of love. In spreading light and love, we participate in God's expansive plan for the world.

***2026 PSA Kick-Off Weekend - Feb. 7-8**

Jubilee Year of St. Francis of Assisi

Pope Leo XIV has proclaimed a **SPECIAL JUBILEE YEAR OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI**, running from January 10, 2026, to January 10, 2027, to mark the 800th anniversary of the saint's death (Transitus). This jubilee offers a plenary indulgence to the faithful who visit Franciscan churches, in the form of a pilgrimage, any Franciscan conventual church or place of worship anywhere in the world dedicated to Saint Francis or connected to him for any reason and engage in prayer for peace, reflecting on Francis's life of poverty and humility. The additional normal conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father) are required to gain the indulgences.

Pilgrims are asked to devote a reasonable period of time in pious meditation and raise prayers to God so that, following the example of Saint Francis, feelings of Christian charity towards their neighbors and authentic vows of harmony and peace among peoples may spring forth in their hearts, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Clare and all the Saints of the Franciscan Family.

"The elderly, the sick and those who take care of them, and all those who are unable to leave their homes for serious reasons may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence, provided they detach themselves from any sin and intend to fulfil the three usual conditions as soon as possible, if they unite themselves spiritually to the jubilee celebrations of the Year of Saint Francis, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, the pains or sufferings of their lives."

WARFARE & BUILDING THE KINGDOM

The Catholic Catechism teaches that the "one Church" exists in three distinct states, which together form the Communion of Saints. These are the Church Militant, the Church Suffering (or Penitent), and the Church Triumphant. The Church Militant consists of the faithful living on earth. They are "militant" because they are engaged in constant spiritual warfare against sin, the world, and the devil. Members are called to be "soldiers of Christ," striving for personal holiness and the transformation of society. The other two states, the Church Suffering, those in purgatory—and the Church Triumphant are the saints and angels who have finished the race and won victory over death.

All three states are interconnected because we are one Church of Christ. Those to be Confirmed take on the name of their patron saint for this reason. We do not walk our earthly journey alone; in our spiritual battles, we are supported by the assistance of the glorious and triumphant Church.

Last Saturday, parents and students of the Faith Formation Program gathered to discuss growing in faith and preparing to receive the Sacraments. Together, we reflected on the importance of God's grace at work throughout the first semester and how we are all called to labor diligently in building God's Kingdom by remaining faithful in living out the Lord's teachings.

In ten days, the season of Lent will begin once again. We will engage in self-denial, that is to empty ourselves of selfishness and to receive purification through fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. The purer our hearts become, the more clearly we will see God's face — even here on earth.
