Reflections of the Week

The instructions we hear Jesus give today are addressed to his disciples, but they can also be read as the instructions he has already given to himself, instructions he will follow all the way to the cross. “Fear no one” (Matthew 10:26): Jesus will not be afraid to speak out against the authorities and those with power. “Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul” (10:28): Jesus stands up to Herod and Pilate, knowing that they cannot harm his soul. “Not one [sparrow] falls to the ground without your Father’s knowledge” (10:29): the Father will raise Jesus from the dead. This perspective makes our mission as Jesus’ disciples easier, for we know that this all has been proven true.

Note that Jesus does not say that God will not allow sparrows to fall to the ground anymore or let you lose any of your hair! No, he just says that the Father watches over us all so that we need not be afraid of loss or death. Saint Paul is able to use the confidence he has in God to proclaim the gospel in hostile situations, eventually facing arrest, imprisonment, and death. As he writes to the Romans, the grace from the Father’s gift of the Son overflows to the whole world. We need not even be afraid of death, for Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life.

Fear can lead us to all sorts of terrible thinking and actions. Fear of what those who are not like us may do can lead to prejudice and intolerance. Fear of what others may think of us can lead us to avoid standing up for our beliefs or for someone who needs our support. Fear of losing our jobs or our wealth can lead us to unethical and selfish actions. Jeremiah recognized the fears he had—of friends betraying him, of being persecuted, of terror—but trusted in God, who would rescue him from all wickedness. Three times Jesus reassures his disciples that there is no need to fear, even of those who might kill them, since we have God on our side. Our only fear should be of denying our faith and giving in to the devil, for then our soul is in true peril.

Magnificent Humanity

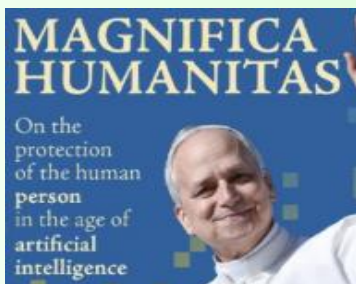
Pope Leo XIV's recent encyclical on artificial intelligence, *Magnifica Humanitas* ("Magnificent Humanity"), offers a profound reflection on the dignity of the human person. The Holy Father emphasizes that humanity must remain at the center of history and progress, cautioning against a world in which technology, efficiency, and innovation overshadow the sacredness of the human heart.

Drawing upon the wisdom of St. Augustine, Pope Leo reminds us that the deep human longing for "more" can never be fully satisfied by technology, transhumanism, or material wealth. Rather, the restless human heart finds its true fulfillment and lasting peace only in a living relationship with God.

Perhaps we need to slow down a bit and ponder these two questions for ourselves in the context of our pope's invitation:

In what ways might I be allowing technology, productivity, or worldly success to shape my identity more than my relationship with God and the dignity of the human person?

St. Augustine reminds us that the human heart longs for something greater. Where am I seeking fulfillment, and how is God inviting me to discover deeper peace and purpose in Him?
